Skills:

The skills required for classic car restoration are numerous and diverse, so it is expected that candidates may be more specialised in certain areas, such as welding or trim and less so in others.

Must have:

- Detailed knowledge of vehicle mechanical systems (engine, transmission, driveline, suspension and brakes).
- Ability to diagnose, assess and repair or replace worn or fault components or assemblies.

- Metalwork skills, corrosion rectification, hand fabrication, welding
- Body preparation skills prior to painting
- Paint rectification and detailing experience
- Classic vehicle electrical system knowledge
- · Ability to trim vehicle interiors with high quality trim kits
